

# PUBLIC PROTECTION AND SAFETY COMMITTEE

## MINUTES

Call to order – The twentieth meeting of the 2009-10 Public Protection & Safety Committee. The meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by Chairman Hanna.

Pledge of Allegiance

Introduction of Committee Members and Guests

Approval of the minutes of the Public Protection and Safety Committee meeting from February 10, 2010. Alderperson Rindfleisch moved to approve. Seconded by Alderperson Bowers. All aye – motion passed.

1. **R. O. No. 405-09-10 (21-29)** from Heidi Payton, Sales and Service Agent for AAA Wisconsin requesting a left turn signal at S. Business Dr. and Wilson Ave. near the Washington Square shopping center for safety reasons. This was discussed with Item 2, **R. O. No. 428-09-10 (22-23)** below. Ryan Sazama advised that he talked to Heidi Payton today. He indicated the road will be restriped in spring or summer and she was okay with that. Alderperson Bowers moved to file. Seconded by Alderperson Rindfleisch. All aye – motion passed.
2. **R. O. No. 428-09-10 (22-23)** from Heidi Payton of AAA Wisconsin bringing forward additional information regarding the need for a turn signal at the intersection of S. Business Dr. and Wilson Ave. This was discussed with Item 1, **R. O. No. 405-09-10 (21-29)** above. Motion to file passed 4 – 0.
3. Discussion and possible action regarding the snow emergency route on Clara Ave. between S. 7<sup>th</sup> St. and S. 8<sup>th</sup> St. adjacent to the Nine 21 Bar and Grill. Ryan Sazama advised that he and Steve Gilbertson met with Paper Box and they made it clear they want to keep the snow emergency route. Ryan and Steve agreed that it made sense and recommended to keep the snow emergency route.
4. **Gen. Ord. No. 56-09-10 (22-34)** by Alderperson Hanna adopting the updated police department records retention schedule as approved by the State of Wisconsin Public Records Board. Alderperson Rindfleisch moved to approve. Seconded by Alderperson Bowers. All aye – motion passed.

5. **Res. No. 186-09-10 (22-32)** by Alderperson Kliejunas providing concrete, measureable guidelines to a “Green Team” of city employees, appointed by the Mayor, to reduce energy, fuel and product use in city departments in 2010. Alderperson Hanna indicated this issue was dealt with in Public Works and referred to department heads. Alderperson Rindfleisch moved to file. Seconded by Alderperson Bowers. All aye – motion passed.
6. **Res. No. 188-09-10 (22-33)** by Alderpersons Bouck and Vue granting St. Nicholas Hospital permission to hold a Freedom Run and Walk on the streets and sidewalks of the City of Sheboygan. This was discussed with Item 7, **R. O. No. 429-09-10 (22-24)** below. Alderperson Bowers moved to file the R. O. and approve the resolution contingent upon receipt of insurance and hold harmless agreement. Seconded by Alderperson Rindfleisch. All aye – motion passed.
7. **R. O. No. 429-09-10 (22-24)** from Susie Runaas of St. Nicholas Hospital requesting permission to sponsor the annual St. Nicholas Hospital Freedom Run on Saturday, July 3, 2010. This was discussed with Item 6, **Res. No. 188-09-10 (22-33)** above. Motion to file passed 4 – 0.
8. **Res. No. 189-09-10 (22-41)** by Alderperson Hanna authorizing the Purchasing Agent to enter into contract for the purchase of five (5) police department patrol duty sedans, less trades, and two (2) police department C.I.D. duty sedans, less trade. This was discussed with Item 9, **R. O. No. 431-09-10 (22-40)** below. Alderperson Hanna asked Police Chief Domagalski if this was in the budget and the Chief replied that it was. Alderperson Bowers questioned whether the bid was for single colored vehicles and who does the painting. He felt there would be a savings of \$500 per unit for single colored vehicles. Alderperson Bowers moved to hold. Alderperson Rindfleisch suggested that if the bid was non-specific the whole process would have to be re-bid. The motion to hold failed for lack of second. Alderperson Rindfleisch moved to approve. Seconded by Alderperson Surek. Motion passed 3 (Hanna, Rindfleisch, Surek) to 1 (Bowers.)
9. **R. O. No. 431-09-10 (22-40)** by the Purchasing Agent submitting a tabulation of Bid #1729-10 received on February 11, 2010, for the purchase of five (5) 2010 Ford Crown Victoria patrol duty sedans, less trades, and two (2) 2010 Chevrolet Impala sedans, less trade, for the police department. This was discussed with Item 8, **Res. No. 189-09-10 (22-41)** above. Motion to approve passed 3 (Hanna, Rindfleisch, Surek) to 1 (Bowers.)
10. **R. O. No. 424-09-10 (22-18)** submitting the report of the Building Inspection Department for the month of January 2010. Alderperson Bowers moved to accept. Seconded by Alderperson Surek. All aye – motion passed.
11. **R. O. No. 425-09-10 (22-19)** from Randy Ingels of Blue Line Sheboygan requesting permission to close Wildwood Ave. from New Jersey Ave. to the Blue Line Ice Center and Julson Ct. from S. 22<sup>nd</sup> St. to Wildwood Ave. for the weekend of Ice Bowling (March 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>, 2010.) Alderperson Hanna reviewed commentary from Assistant City Attorney Adams, stating that the proper action would be to file the R. O. and recommend that the police department close the streets as requested. Mr. Ingels was present. Steve Gilbertson advised that there are some folding No Parking signs along that stretch of road that can be dropped down for No Parking. He indicated he would need something from the Police Department stating the days they would want the signs dropped. Alderperson Rindfleisch moved to file the R. O. and recommend that the Police Department close the

streets as requested and communicate with Public Works that they want the signs dropped. Seconded by Alderperson Surek. All aye – motion passed.

12. **R. O. No. 427-09-10 (22-21)** from Glen Pilling stating information needed from the fire department before intelligent staffing decisions can be made. Mr. Pilling was present and spoke about his concerns. Alderperson Hanna suggested that Mr. Pilling's document could be referred to the Fire Chief for him to respond back to the committee with answers to Mr. Pilling's questions. Alderperson Rindfleisch moved to hold the R. O. until the next meeting. Seconded by Alderperson Bowers. All aye – motion passed.
13. **R. O. No. 426-09-10 (22-20)** from the State of Wisconsin Department of Corrections to file an appeal to the Sex Offender Residency restrictions on behalf of State Inmate Rene Cordova. Alderperson Hanna advised that this item has been withdrawn.
14. **R. O. No. 430-09-10 (22-36)** from the State of Wisconsin Department of Corrections to file an appeal to the Sex Offender Residency restrictions on behalf of probationer James D. Turner, Jr., for Transitional Living Placement. Matt Kraus of the Department of Corrections was present. After a review of Mr. Turner's arrest/conviction history, Alderperson Hanna inquired whether he has a spouse or parents that live in the city and have lived here for over two years. Matt Kraus replied that he has parents in the city who have lived here for more than two years. Mr. Kraus advised that Mr. Turner would be on GPS not just the standard electronic monitoring. Alderperson Bowers moved to approve the placement of James Turner in the transitional living placement facility. Seconded by Alderperson Rindfleisch. All aye – motion passed.

#### **MATTERS TO HOLD:**

**R. C. No. 417-09-10 (21-19)** by Alderperson Hanna repealing and recreating Article VI Division 3 of Chapter 50 of the Municipal Code so as to update the smoke detector ordinance and require specific types of smoke alarms; recommends that the attached Substitute Ordinance be passed.
