

# PUBLIC PROTECTION AND SAFETY COMMITTEE

## MINUTES

Call to order – The twenty-first meeting of the 2010-11 Public Protection & Safety Committee  
The meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by Chairperson Kittelson.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Introduction of Committee Members.

Approval of the minutes of the Public Protection and Safety Committee meeting from March 2, 2011. Alderperson Montemayor moved to approve. Seconded by Alderperson Sampson. All aye – motion passed.

5. **R. O. No. 436-10-11 (23-44)** submitting a communication from Aaron Brault, Anne Nemschoff and Paul Weaver requesting approval to host Sheboygan first and only Olympic Distance, USAT sanctioned Triathlon on Saturday, August 13<sup>th</sup> on the South Pier District. Anne Nemschoff was present. She explained that her group wanted to hold the event at the south pier and were waiting for the Pentair building to come down so there could be multiple ingress and egresses for bikes, attendees and athletes. Chad Pelishek of Planning & Development was present. He pointed out that the City does not own the Pentair property and the group should get approval from Pentair to utilize their property. He also pointed out that if the grass areas or parking lots at the south pier will be used for staging, the Redevelopment Authority should be involved as they own the land. Alderperson Kittelson reviewed Assistant City Attorney Adams' recommendations regarding street closures, a parade permit and insurance. Ms. Nemschoff will work with Sgt. Anderson of the police department on the route and the permit. Discussion continued regarding the number of participants expected and other events of this type throughout the state and the country. Alderperson Montemayor moved to file the document and support the request. Seconded by Alderperson Sampson. All aye – motion passed.
  
1. **R. O. No. 434-10-11 (23-22)** submitting a communication from Susannah Bird, President of "Two Left Paws" Animal Sanctuary requesting permission to hold their "Paws in the Park" Pet Walk at Lake View Park on Saturday, June 4, 2011. Alderperson Heidemann moved to file. Seconded by Alderperson Montemayor. All aye – motion passed.

2. **R.O. No. 435-10-11 (23-23)** submitting a communication from the Sheboygan Yacht Club requesting approvals for licenses, permits and normal city festival “package” assistance for a new family-oriented active lifestyle event to be held on June 18<sup>th</sup> named “Harbor Fest” specifically “Sheboygan Yacht club Harbor Fest to Benefit Safe Harbor”. ACA Adams pointed out that if they will be using City property for the sale of alcohol, specific permission will be needed. There wasn’t a specific request for this. ACA Adams suggested that the committee could file the document, approve the event and the use of City property as necessary within the guidelines. They would also need to go to the Chief of Police if a parade permit is needed. Alderperson Montemayor moved to approve ACA Adams’ recommendation. Seconded by Alderperson Heidemann. All aye – motion passed.
3. **Gen. Ord. No. 53-10-11 (23-40)** by Alderperson Dekker, an ordinance repealing and recreating §118-242 and §42-104 of the Sheboygan Municipal Code so as to exempt vehicles legally parked in on-street handicapped parking zones from the winter parking and snow emergency rules. Steve Gilbertson from the Department of Public Works expressed that his department has reservations about this. He questioned how much activity is happening between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. that would require handicapped parking to be exempted. Alderperson Heidemann moved to hold this document until Alderperson Dekker can be present. Discussion continued in reference to the content and repercussions of the ordinance. Motion to hold was seconded by Alderperson Sampson. All aye – motion passed.
4. **Comm. No. 64-10-11 (23-43)** submitting a communication from James Reinl reminding the Council to “drop” flip-flop parking for the rest of the month of March after Daylight Savings time starts. James Reinl was present. ACA Adams explained that a neighborhood cannot be exempted but the ordinance could be changed for the City. Steve Gilbertson pointed out that some areas have posted parking rules for December 1<sup>st</sup> through April 1<sup>st</sup>, which coincides with the winter parking rules. There would be cost significance to replace those signs. Chief Domagalski indicated that enforcement becomes a problem when we have a patchwork of different rules throughout the City. Alderperson Montemayor moved to file. Seconded by Alderperson Heidemann. All aye – motion passed.
6. **R. O. No. 433-10-11 (23-48)** by Building Inspection Department. We hereby submit the report of the Building Inspection Department for the month of: FEBRUARY 2011. Chad Pelishek advised that building permit cash receipts are tracking higher and he thinks there is in upward trend in development across the board. Alderperson Montemayor moved to accept and file. Seconded by Alderperson Heidemann. All aye – motion passed.
7. **R. O. No. 432-10-11 (23-20)** Submitting a request for a waiver of the Sex Offender Restrictions from Randy Schramke. Lt. Riddiough of the Police Department advised that Mr. Schramke has an agent assigned through the Green Bay office (Department of Corrections.) His conviction is out of Brown County. Alderperson Heidemann moved to deny. Seconded by Alderperson Montemayor. All aye – motion passed.
8. **R. O. No. 430-10-11 (23-18)** Submitting a communication from the State of Wisconsin Department of Corrections requesting an appeal to the Sex Offender Residency restrictions on behalf of Paul Hilbelink. Josh Butzen was present from the Department of Corrections. He advised that Mr. Hilbelink will be coming out of Oshkosh Correctional on

April 12<sup>th</sup>. This request is for the TLP. There is no family within Sheboygan County. Alderperson Montemayor moved to put him at the TLP. Seconded by Alderperson Sampson. All aye – motion passed.

9. **R. O. No. 431-10-11 (23-19)** Submitting a communication from the State of Wisconsin Department of Corrections requesting an appeal to the Sex Offender Residency restrictions on behalf of Shawn M. Pope. Holly Rick was present from the Department of Corrections. She explained that Mr. Pope was approved to go to the TLP in September but was then incarcerated for an old unpaid fine in Rock County Jail for six months. He is asking for placement at the TLP for which he was originally approved. Alderperson Montemayor moved to approve putting him at the TLP. Seconded by Alderperson Sampson. All aye – motion passed.
