## MINUTES

Call to order – The 2nd meeting of the 2010-11 Public Protection & Safety Committee. The meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by Alderperson Montemayor.

Pledge of Allegiance

Approval of minutes from April 28, 2010 meeting.

Introduction of Committee Members and Guests

- 1. R.O. No. 16-10-11 (3-26)** from Chief Domagalski of the Sheboygan Police Department stating that the Sheboygan Jaycee's organization has approached him inquiring if the Police Department would have any problems or concerns if they requested the Council for an extension of hours to service alcoholic beverages for the 2010 Bratwurst Day event. No objections by the Police Department. Motion made to approve made by Alderman Dekker, seconded by Alderman Radtke All ayes.
- 2. R.O. No. 17-10-10 (3-27)** from Donna Cvetan, Chairperson of Lakeshore Weekend, requesting a "variance" to the sound and beverage ordinance for their 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Miesfeld's Lakeshore Weekend to benefit Children's Hospital of Wisconsin at Kiwanis Park on August 13-15, 2010, and also requesting that the access street to Kiwanis Park be blocked in order to promote a safe environment. Alderman Dekker made motion to approve, seconded by Alderman Heidemann. All ayes.
- 3. R.O. No. 18-10-11 (3-29)** from Jennifer Jacobs, Campaign Manager of the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society's Scenic Shore 150 Bike Tour, stating that they will be in our area with approximately 1000 bike riders and wish to have some traffic control if deemed necessary by the City for Saturday and Sunday, July 24 and 25, 2010, and checking if there are any conflicting events that weekend. Motion to approve made by Alderman Dekker, seconded by Alderman Heidemann. All ayes.

No. 20-10-11 (3-31)** from Mike Warner lending his support to the Mayor's comments asserting that the Council, at times, succumbs to the vocal pressure of a few to the detriment of many is right on target, giving the issue of lifting the hiring freeze for the Sheboygan Fire Department as a prime example. Motion made to hold made by Alderman Dekker, seconded by Alderman Heidemann. All Ayes.

Chief Domagalski stated grant money could be used to enforce speeding violations in this area. Motion to file made by Alderman Dekker, seconded by Alderman Radtke. All ayes.
6. **R.O. No. 22-10-11 (3-48)** from Bill Schwobe of Bill's Café requesting a sign for a parking restriction on Wilson Ave in front of his business. Ryan said the area needs to be measured. Motion made to hold made by Alderman Radtke, seconded by Alderman Dekker. All ayes.

No. 24-10-11 (3-33)** from Denny Moyer, General Manager of the Sheboygan A's, stating they will be hosting the Heroes of the Diamond, the United States Military All-Star Team, at Wildwood Baseball Park on July 26<sup>th</sup> and requesting that the Council consider issuing a proclamation for this event; consider closing off Wildwood Ave to traffic from 10 a.m. to midnight, and requesting the Department of Public Works loan bunting and flags to decorate the park for that night. He requests parking be restricted on Wildwood from New Jersey to south of VFW driveway. Motion made to approve by Alderman Dekker, seconded by Alderman Heidemann. All ayes
8. **R.O. No. 23-10-11 (3-54)** submitting Incident Detail Prints – Sheboygan Police Department and a summary of Ambulance Response times for the period 1/1/10 through 3/31/10 submitted by Alderperson Versey. Motion made by Alderman Radtke, seconded by Alderman Heidemann to refer to Committee of the Whole. Alderman Heideman and Radtke voted to approve, Alderman Dekker and Alderperson Montemayor opposed. Motion failed. Motion made to hold by Alderman Heidemann, seconded by Alderman Radtke. Alderman Heidemann and Alderman Radtke voted to approved, Alderman Dekker and Alderperson Montemayor opposed. Motion failed. Motion to file made by Alderman Dekker, seconded by Alderperson Montemayor. Alderman Dekker and Alderperson voted to approve, Alderman Heideman and Alderman Radtke voted to oppose. Motion failed. Alderman Heidemann made motion to send to Council with no action, seconded by Alderman Radtke. All ayes.
9. **R.O. No. 15-10-11 (3-25)** from the State of Wisconsin Department of Corrections requesting a waiver of the Sexual Offender Residency restrictions for Albert Webster. Albert Webster withdrew his request. Motion made to file made by Alderman Dekker, seconded by Alderman Radtke. All ayes.
10. **R.O. No. 19-10-11 (3-30)** from Bonifacio Ordonez requesting a waiver from the Sex Offender Residency Ordinance. Motion to deny made by Alderman Heidemann, seconded by Alderman Dekker. All ayes.

11. **R. O. No. 498-09-10 (25-55)** from Terry Blevons filing an appeal to the Sexual Offender Residency restrictions. Motion made by Alderman Dekker to deny, seconded by Alderman Radtke. All ayes.
12. **R. O. No. 499-09-10 (25-57)** from Keith D. Bauer filing an appeal to the Sexual Offender Residency restrictions. Motion made to approve made by Alderperson Montemayor, seconded by Alderman Radtke. Alderman Heidemann and Alderman Dekker voted to oppose, Alderman Radtke and Alderperson Monteymayor voted to approve. Motion fails. Alderman Heidemann made motion to hold, seconded by Alderman Radtke. All ayes.
13. **R.O. No. 518-09-10 (26-27)** from Mai Seng Xiong filing an appeal to the Sexual Offender Residency restrictions. Motion made by Alderman Heidemann to deny, seconded by Alderman Radtke. All ayes.
